Who We Are




- American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU)

Federal and State Politics

- Federal
- House 241-194 GOP Majority
- Senate 52-46-2 GOP Majority
- 2018 Senate Races (23 Dem, 9 GOP, 2 Ind)
- Status of White House and Agencies
 - a) Who is there?
 - b) What do we know about higher ed priorities?
- State—Conservative Power at a Peak
 - Highest Republican control in nearly 100 years
 - 25 states w/total GOP control vs 6 for Dems
 - 2018 elections are pivotal for redistricting
 - 36 governors up in 2018









Budget and Appropriations

Federal

- FY17 funding expires April 28. Shutdown Showdown?
- Deal on defense and nondefense sequestration relief may be over
- FY18 Trump "skinny budget" is indeed skinny on higher ed community's priorities
- Student aid in F17 and FY18. Challenges to come

- Many state budgets=lagging revenue numbers
- State-specific issues, but oil/gas revenues are down
- Little political support for enhancing revenue=budget cuts
- Public higher ed expecting sizable cuts in many states





Affordability

Federal

- Status of HEA reauthorization: not this year
- No agreement on causes of increased tuition and how or whether to address
- Proliferation of Bennett Hypothesis: Student aid drives up tuition
- Clinton and Sanders changed the conversation among Dems

- Press by governors & legislators to hold down tuition increases.
 Debt concerns. But what now w/ budget cuts?
- Tuition increases in recent years=mild
- Free college movement. Big legislation in NY.
- Quality?





Economic and Workforce Development

Federal

It's about the jobs



- Most popular higher ed connection with governors
- Workforce development, research and innovation, career pathways



Campus Safety

Federal

- Campus Accountability and Safety Act
- Campus sexual assault response coordinators, MOUs w/ law enforcement, institutional penalties, due process, climate surveys

- Lots of bills introduced nationwide.
- Concerns re: due process. Georgia bill.
- Other proposals: affirmative consent, transcript notations, mandatory reporting, protection for witnesses, anonymous reporting online, amnesty





Accountability

Federal

- Do we have the data to measure performance?
- Risk sharing, role of accreditors vs. Department of Education
- Who to target? For-profits? "wealthy" institutions?

- Around 35 states either have performance-based funding or are developing it.
- Legislation approved in AR, proposed in WI, unveiled in KY.
- Key question: Does it work? What are the side effects?



Immigration/Undocumented Students

Federal

- Climate for international students
- Status of DACA and Travel Ban 2.0
- Visa policy to come

- 7 states, 13 bills introduced cracking down on "sanctuary campus" (h/t NASPA). AL, AR, GA, PA, MS, TN, TX. Is "sanctuary" a check that can't be cashed?
- More bills changing policy on in-state tuition for undocumented. Approximate 18 states allow in-state tuition to immigrants, 6 extend financial aid





Guns on Campus

• State

- Around 14 states considering guns on campus bills (h/t NASPA). AR approved bill, GA on guv's desk. MD gun control.
- 17 states ban outright, 23 punt to campuses, 9 allow guns. TN allows guns for faculty/staff. (h/t NCSL)



Free Speech/Civil Rights/Culture

Federal




- State
 - Lots of discussions today re: free spech (Milo, Coulter, etc.)
 - State bill to eliminate "free speech zones"
 - Codify academic freedom
 - Civil Rights: "Bathroom bills" in 16 states, 6 states that would override local anti-discriminatory measures, 14 states would limit transgender rights (h/t NCSL)
