



On Friday, January 27, an Executive Order on Immigration was issued that blocks citizens of seven countries from entering the United State for 90 days: Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen.

While none of our current students are citizens of these countries, staff in our Division of Student Affairs, particularly the Office of International Programs, have been in contact with our F-1 international students to offer support and counsel.
